THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Hi! I'm Snowball 2, the Simpsons' cat. I sometimes *play* with a ball but I *don't do* much exercise... the sofa *is* my favourite place!! But....
Do you know the Simpsons? Let me introduce them...



THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Homer *is* the father. He's
36 years old. He *loves*
donuts and *drinks* Duff
beer. He *works* at the
Springfield Nuclear
Power Plant but he
doesn't like it!!



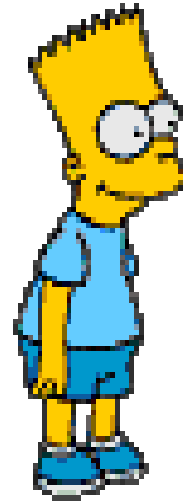
THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Marge *is* the mother.
She's 34 and she *is* a
housewife. She usually
does the shopping and all
the housework. She
doesn't like flying.



THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Bart *is* the son. He's 10. He *doesn't like* studying, often *plays* pranks on others and *says* "I didn't do it!!!"



THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Lisa *is* one of Bart's sisters. She's 8 and she's very intelligent. She *loves* reading and playing saxophone. She *doesn't like* meat... she's a vegetarian.



THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Maggie *is* 1 year old. She's the baby. She still *sucks* on her pacifier. She *doesn't walk* but she usually *goes* everywhere with her mother.



THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

Santa's Little Helper *is* the dog. He *fetches* the paper and *destroys* it and *doesn't mind* sharing the sofa with me. He *loves* playing with Bart and Lisa.



THE PRESENT SIMPLE and The Simpsons

They *live* in Springfield.
They *are* yellow and *have got*
big eyes and small ears!!!

EXPRESSIONS OF FREQUENCY

Adverbs of frequency

*I **usually** advise them about equipment.*

*People in these situations **often** have no confidence.*

*I **always** try to make them feel more confident.*

*They are **always** really grateful.*

*I **rarely** get home before 6.30 in the evening.*

Adverbial phrases

***Most days** I visit people in their homes.*

*I write reports and attend meetings **every day**.*

Answers

- 1 Adverbs of frequency usually go before the main verb in the present simple (*usually advise, often have*)
- 2 They go after the verb *be* (*are always*).
- 3 They can go at the beginning of the sentence (*Most days I visit...*) or at the end (*...meetings every day.*).
