Spelling Rules

- Add *-s* to most verbs after *He / She / It*:
start → *starts*, *work* → *works*
- Add *-es* after verbs ending with *-s*, *-sh*, or *-ch*: *finish* → *finishes*, *watch* → *watches*
- With verbs that end in *-y*, replace the *y* with an *i* and add *-es*. *study* → *studies*
